

Due to the COVID-19 outbreak, SDCSC will begin eLearning on Tuesday, November 17, 2020. Teachers will provide eLearning lessons on Tuesday with no live instruction, however, teachers will be available to assist students through email. On Wednesday, November 18th, SDCSC will begin virtual learning in which teachers and students will run the traditional daily classroom schedule with live Google Meets.

Throughout this extended school closure, teachers will continue to utilize Google Meet to hold virtual classroom meetings and instruction. They will implement the traditional setting schedule currently in place and will communicate meeting times with students through Google Classroom, email, or Class Dojo. Please see the answers to some frequently asked questions below. If you need additional information, please email your child's teacher or building administrator.

How will eLearning days be different from traditional eLearning days as a result of the COVID-19 extended school closure?

Teachers will be scheduling virtual class meetings utilizing Google Meet providing students the opportunity to meet face-to-face with teachers each day (M-F).

Virtual class meetings will be recorded and posted for students to access if they are unable to attend the scheduled Meet.

Students are required to attend the scheduled Google Meets throughout the day and complete assignments by the teacher's designated due date. Students who are unable to attend scheduled Google Meets must access the recorded meet and respond to discussion questions provided by the teacher.

How do students access a Google Meet?

Students access Google Meet through Clever or Google Classroom as directed by teachers on their school issued chromebook. Once students log into the program, they will see meetings they have been invited to by their classroom teacher. Students may also access a Google Meet through a teacher's invitation link that will be posted in Google Classroom. They simply click on the Join Now button.
